Topic: Storytelling



1.	What is a narrator?	A person who tells the story to the audience
2.	Why is facing the front important in Drama?	So that everyone can see what you are doing
3.	What is volume?	How loud or quietly you speak
4.	What is meant by tone in Drama?	How you say certain words (angry/happy/harshly)
5.	What is meant by intonation in Drama?	The rise and fall of your speech, making some words more important
6.	Why is it important to project your voice in Drama?	So that the audience can hear you
7.	What is a still image?	Holding a position for at least 10 seconds, a key moment that the audience need to see
8.	What is a chorus in Drama?	A group of actors who speak and move at the same time
9.	What are facial expressions?	Movements with your face to show the audience what you are feeling/thinking
10.	What is exaggeration?	Making something larger for a specific reason (eg making your movements bigger so the audience can see them)

Learn these questions to build a strong foundation of knowledge for this half-term. Ask family or friends to test you regularly, or practise on your own using the 'Look, Say, Cover, Write' method
