1.	What was the Weimar Republic?	Germany's new democratic government set up after World War I.
2.	When was the Weimar Republic established?	1919.
3.	Who was the first President of the Weimar Republic?	Friedrich Ebert.
4.	What was the Treaty of Versailles?	A peace treaty that blamed Germany for WWI and punished it harshly.
5.	When was the Treaty of Versailles signed?	June 1919.
6.	Why did Germans hate the Treaty of Versailles?	It blamed them for the war, took land, limited the army and forced them to pay reparations.
7.	What were the terms of the Treaty of Versailles?	War guilt, reparations, army limited to 100,000 men, no air force or tanks, loss of land.
8.	What was the 'stab in the back' myth?	The idea that Germany lost WWI because politicians betrayed the army.
9.	What was the Spartacist Uprising (1919)?	A left-wing communist revolt led by Rosa Luxemburg and Karl Liebknecht. (1920)?
10.	What was the Kapp Putsch (1920)?	A right-wing attempt to take over Berlin using ex-soldiers called Freikorps.
11.	What caused hyperinflation in 1923?	Germany printed money to pay workers during the Ruhr crisis.
12.	What happened during hyperinflation?	Prices went up very fast and money became worthless.
13.	What was the occupation of the Ruhr?	French and Belgian troops took over Germany's Ruhr region in 1923 to get reparations.
14.	Who was Gustav Stresemann?	A German politician who helped stabilise the economy and improve foreign relations.
15.	What was the Rentenmark?	A new currency introduced by Stresemann to stop hyperinflation.
16.	What was the Dawes Plan (1924)?	A plan for the USA to lend money to Germany to help pay reparations.
17.	What was the Young Plan (1929)?	A plan to reduce Germany's reparations and extend the time to pay.
18.	What was the Golden Age of Weimar Germany?	A period of stability, culture, and prosperity from 1924 to 1929.
19.	Why was the Weimar Republic always unstable?	It had many enemies, weak coalition governments and economic problems.
20.	How did the Great Depression affect Weimar Germany?	It caused mass unemployment and made people lose faith in democracy.
