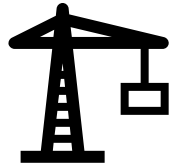
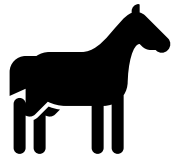
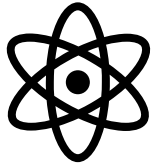

- Agriculture- 40,698 jobs in agriculture, mostly arable
- Manufacturing- Manufacture of food products 13,681 people
- Construction- 22,183 jobs. Most of these jobs are related to building construction
- Offshore wind energy- 70% of the UK's offshore wind capacity
- Digital- 18,695 jobs, with activities ranging from electronics manufacturing to publishing and media production
- Life sciences- 2500+ Natural sciences and engineering
