GCSE Drama helps students to develop skills that they can take on with them to further education or future jobs. It is not only for students who want to become an actor, there are many other transferable skills students will learn over the course of the 2 years.

These include:

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Examination and Assessment: Examination Board: AQA

GCSE Drama consists of three components which you will begin to study in Year 10 and complete in Year 11

Component	What you will complete	Percentage of GCSE	Internal/External
Component 1: Understanding Drama	One set play from a choice of 6, analysis and evaluation of a live performance. This is a written examination completed at the end of Year 11	40%	External written exam 1 hour 45 minutes
Component 2: Devising Drama	Devised performance from a given stimulus (20 marks), written log to accompany (40 marks)	40%	Internal examination
Component 3: Texts in Practice	Performance of two extracts from one play (20 marks for each performance)	20%	External examination
