Course Overview

Why study History?

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GCSE History helps students make sense of the world we live in today by focusing on the key events, issues and people that have helped shape this world. By studying the past, students can better understand the present.

GCSE History equips students with transferable and employable skills, such as gathering and analysing data; evaluating and analysing sources and interpretations; formulating arguments; reaching judgements and communicating clearly.

History is relevant to a variety of careers, including Law, Journalism, TV and Radio, Politics and Local Government, the Police and the Armed Forces. Those considering a career in medicine or science may find the thematic study on medicine of particular interest.



Course Overview

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What topics will students be studying?

- Thematic unit: The history of medicine in Britain, circa 1250 to the present
- The historic environment: medicine in the trenches of World War One

- Period study: Superpower Relations and the Cold War, 1941-1991
- British depth study: Early Elizabethan England, 1558-1588

- Modern depth study: Weimar and Nazi Germany, 1918-1939

GCSE History is externally assessed in three exams at the end of Year 11

Exam Paper	Topics Examined	Percentage of GCSE	Length of Exam
Exam 1: Thematic study and the historic environment	Medicine in Britain, c1250–present & The British sector of the Western Front, 1914–18: injuries, treatment and the trenches.	30%	1 hour 15 minutes
Exam 2: Period study & British depth study	Superpower Relations and the Cold War, 1941-1991 & Early Elizabethan England, 1558-1588.	40%	1 hour 45 minutes
Exam 3: Modern depth study	Weimar and Nazi Germany, 1918-1939.	30%	1 hour 20 minutes
