Birdsong     by Sebastian Faulkes	This is the story of Stephen, a young Englishman, who arrives in Amiens, France in 1910. His life goes through a series of traumatic experiences, from the clandestine love affair that tears apart the family he is living with, to the unprecedented experiences of the war itself.	
Misery     by Stephen King	An author has written a series of books but wants to try something different so he kills off the main character. He is on his way to publish a new novel when he crashes his car and is rescued by a nurse who is his number one fan. When she finds out that the series she loved is finished she uses some very disturbing techniques to hold him hostage until he starts writing it again.	
<ul> <li>The Book Thief by Markus Zusak</li> </ul>	It is 1939. Nazi Germany. Death has never been busier. By her brother's graveside, Liesel's life is changed when she picks up The Gravedigger's Handbook. It is her first act of book thievery and, with the help of her foster father, she learns to read. Soon she is stealing books from Nazi book- burnings, the mayor's wife's library, wherever there are books to be found. But this is a dangerous time and set to get worse when her family hides a Jew in their basement.	
Perfume     by Patrick Suskind	Jean-Baptiste is abandoned on the filthy streets of Paris as a child, but grows up to discover he has an extraordinary gift: a sense of smell more powerful than any other human's. Soon, he is creating the most sublime fragrances in all the city. Yet there is one odour he cannot capture. These are the memoirs of a Frenchman who becomes obsessed with the 'ultimate' smell – human blood!	
Mister Pip by Lloyd Jones	Matilda lives on an island in the South Pacific that is succumbing to war. When the children are told by the island's only white man that he will introduce them to Mr Dickens they are excited and thinking this foreigner will bring them gifts. Instead Mr Watts recites Great Expectations to them which they devour with relish. But on an island at war, the power of fiction has dangerous consequences.

A few days later Simon staggered into Base Camp exhausted and frost-bitten, with news that Joe was dead. This story reveals what happened to Joe on the mountain after Simon cut the rope holding his friend.</li> <li>The beckoning silence – Heart stopping rock-climbing stories</li> </ul>	
Life: An Exploded Diagram     by Mal Peet	Clem lives in a modest house with his mother and grandmother. Frankie is the daughter of a wealthy farmer. They fall in love during the tense days of the Cuban missile crisis when the world is on tenterhooks about the possibility that everything will be destroyed in the blink of an eye.	
Animal Farm by George Orwell	Mr Jones of Manor Farm is so lazy and drunken that one day he forgets to feed his livestock. The ensuing rebellion under the leadership of the pigs Napoleon and Wellington leads to the animals taking over the farm. But as time passes, the ideals of the rebellion are corrupted, then forgotten. And something new and unexpected emerges. "Animal Farm" - the history of a revolution that went wrong - is George Orwell's brilliant satire on the corrupting influence of power.	

<ul> <li>Good Omens by Terry Pratchett (and Neil Gaiman)</li> </ul>	People have been predicting the end of the world almost from its very beginning, so it's only natural to be sceptical when a new date is set for Judgement Day. But what if, for once, the predictions are right, and the apocalypse really is due to arrive next Saturday, just after tea? You could spend the time left drowning your sorrows, giving away all your possessions in preparation for the rapture, or laughing it off as (hopefully) just another hoax. Or you could just try to do something about it.
Great Expectations     by Charles Dickens	As a small boy Pip meets two people who will affect his whole life - an escaped convict he is forced to help, and the eccentric Miss Haversham, who looks after a beautiful, cold girl who Pip adores. When a secret benefactor pays for him to go to London to become a gentleman, Pip dreams about a future with his Estelle. Unfortunately through a chain of events, his life follows an altogether more murderous path.
Life of Pi by Yann Martel	After the tragic sinking of a cargo ship, a solitary lifeboat remains bobbing on the wild blue Pacific. The only survivors from the wreck are a sixteen-year-old boy named Pi, a hyena, a zebra (with a broken leg), a female orang- utan - and a 450-pound Royal Bengal tiger
Nineteen Eighty-four by George Orwell	Winston works for the ruling party, rewriting old news so it makes the leaders seem perfect. However he rebels against the party which watches everyone and everything to ensure total obedience. He begins a love affair with Julia but it must be kept completely secret as all relationships are illegal. A bleak future is set in this classic novel where everything you say and do is contrived and censored.
<ul> <li>Cider With Rosie</li> <li>As I Walked Out One Midsummer Morning</li> <li>A Moment of War</li> <li>by Laurie Lee (one book counts)</li> </ul>	Auto-biographical stories of growing up in England, travelling through Europe and getting caught up in the Spanish Civil War. Laurie depicts a word that is both tangibly real yet belonging to a now distant past.
<ul> <li>The Kite Runner by Khalid Hosseini</li> </ul>	The Kite runner - Amir is desperate to win the local kite- fighting tournament and his loyal friend Hassan promises to help him. But something soul-destroying happens to Hassan that afternoon. Amir witnesses it, but consumed with fear he does nothing to help. After the Russians invade and the family is forced to flee to America, Amir realises that one day he must return to Afghanistan under Taliban rule to find the one thing that his new world cannot grant him: redemption.
Wild Swans     by Jung Chang	A true and amazing account of three generations of Chinese women - grandmother, mother and daughter – from the ancient tradition of foot binding to the Long March and Cultural Revolution.
<ul> <li>My Sister's Keeper by Jodi Picoult</li> </ul>	Anna was only born to keep her sister alive. She is genetically engineered to be a biological match for her sister who has leukaemia. She has spent her life giving blood and bone marrow to Kate and is under pressure to give a kidney. But, Anna wants her own life – and who can blame her?
<ul> <li>The Time Traveler's Wife by Audrey Niffenegger</li> </ul>	This is the story of Clare and Henry who have known each other since Clare was six and Henry was thirty-six. They were married when Clare was twenty-two and Henry thirty. Impossible but true, because Henry has a disorder where his genetic clock resets and he gets pulled suddenly into the past or future – alternately harrowing and amusing.
