Careers at KS4 builds upon students experiences at KS3 by clarifying the skills, knowledge and attitudes students need to have a positive career.

Curriculum is fit for 21st century by enabling students to be happy with the way they spend their time, being able to make a contribution to their community and having a decent standard of living. One key aim is to encourage students to be reflective of their own skill set and to fully explore their opportunities ready for life beyond OBHS.

Our Careers curriculum focuses on six main learning areas to ensure students are equipped for lifelong career development: grow throughout life, explore possibilities, manage career, create opportunities, balance life and work, see the big picture. Ultimately students engage with all of these concepts through varied learning opportunities.

Citizenship at KS4 fosters students keen awareness of democracy, government and how laws are made and upheld. Students explore political and social issues critically, to weigh evidence, debate and make reasoned arguments. There is also a focus on being a responsible citizen, managing money well and make sound financial decisions.

Curriculum is fit for 21st century by providing students with knowledge, skills and understanding to prepare them to play a full and active part in society.

Citizenship at KS4 builds on students prior learning around democracy, government, and the rights and responsibilities of citizens, rules and laws and the justice system, function and uses of money.

PSHE at KS4 builds upon students experiences at KS3 by furthering their knowledge, skills and attributes they need to keep themselves healthy and safe and prepare them for life in modern Britain.

Curriculum is fit for 21st century by enabling students to manage their lives now and in the future. PSHE helps students to manage critical opportunities, challenges and responsibilities they will face growing up.

By using a spiral curriculum all of the three main PSHE themes have been delivered at KS3. They are revisited at KS4 with signposting to advice and guidance and material covered at an age appropriate level.

RE at KS4 builds upon student's experiences at KS3 and prepares them for life in a world where controversy over beliefs, faith and values is prevalent. Students need religious knowledge to make informed decisions whatever their own family background and personal beliefs and practices.

Curriculum is fit for 21st century by giving students a balanced understanding of the world in which they live. Religious literacy is at the heart giving students the ability to hold balanced and well-informed conversations about religions and worldviews.

Religious Education is about enabling students to become free thinkers, critical participants of society, who can make informed judgements about important matters of religion and belief and shape the global landscape.
