Online Synchronised Following our existing curriculum narrative	Live lessons with an introduction. Lesson resources uploaded on to Teams. Use a variety of resources such as Hegarty, Seneca, Youtube, Mathsbox and Corbett maths etc. Use visualiser with KS3 / 4/ exam papers.	Feedback at the end of the live lesson. Assessments at the end of half term and end of term.  Corbett maths assessments.	Summative assessments are normally completed in lessons and are at the end of each term. In the case of remote learning these will emailed to students and will be completed by them at home. Staff will mark the assessments and feedback by email or through Teams. The assessments are not usually conducted live but will be 'online asynchronised' or will be paper based.
Online Asynchronised Following our existing curriculum narrative	All groups will have their own tile on Microsoft Teams where resources will be uploaded for each live lesson. These resources will be typically saved under 'Files' or assignments in their respective group tiles. All live lessons will be recorded and saved on Teams on each group's tile so that students may watch the live lesson at a later date.	Assessments may be set on Hegarty or Seneca learning which gives instant feedback. Students may leave questions regarding a piece of work or assessment on Hegarty in which case teachers will leave written comments for the students to read at a later stage.	Summative assessments are normally completed in lessons and are at the end of each term. In the case of remote learning these will emailed to students and will be completed by them at home. Staff will mark the assessments and feedback by email or through Teams.
Paper based Asynchronised Following our existing curriculum narrative	KS3 and KS4 +exam papers we have ordered some workbooks and revision guides to be sent home. Students are to complete the work in the workbooks and will mark their work using the mark schemes which are included.	Exam papers sent home, marked as normal.  Feedback – papers posted back home.	At KS3 end of term assessments will be sent to students in paper format. Papers will be marked in the traditional sense and returned to students by post. Feedback will be given on the exam paper and may include worked solutions or the mark scheme.  At KS4 the process will be very similar to that at KS3 but will typically be exam past papers.
