Component	What you will complete	Percentage of GCSE	Internal/External
Component 1:  Performing	A minimum of two pieces, lasting a total of 4-6 minutes, recorded in the year of assessment (Year 11).	30%	Internally assessed
Component 2: Composing	Two pieces: One in response to a brief set by the exam board, in Year 11. One free composition – Any style you want to write in.	30%	Internally assessed
Component 3:  Appraising	Externally assessed listening examination with questions about music and genres studied throughout the course.	40%	External written exam 1 hour 15minutes
