Year 7, 8 and 9 Maths

Following the first term of this academic year, we have reviewed student performance, taken teachers' feedbacks on the groups, and considered carefully our current approach to grouping within Maths. We strive to ensure that our practice is informed by current educational research in addition to reviewing our current strategies and approaches based on in-school evidence and data. As there is limited evidence (both in the educational world and from in-school data) that setting by ability accelerates the progress or attainment of all learners, we will be making some adjustments to the student groupings in Years 7, 8 and 9. We will be creating stranded groups (parallel groups of similar abilities). The Centre for Excellence in Maths Teaching state that "*The essential features of teaching for mastery in maths are working to develop understanding, keeping the class together working on the same content and believing that every child can succeed.*" The changes we are putting in place will create a system which values the progress of all learners equally. The changes will be in effect as of Monday 23rd February and will not affect students' tier of entry.

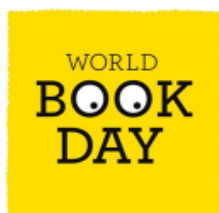

Year 11 Guided Study Session Timetables:

We have put together a programme of guided study sessions to support Year 11 in their independent revision. On the days and times timetabled, there will be a subject specialist available in the room identified. Students should attend the guided study session with a clear focus from their Personal Learning Checklist or mark-scheme from any recent assessment.

These sessions are not lessons: the teacher will be able to offer subject specific advice and resources to ensure that students have the resources and are confident and prepared to undertake their independent revision throughout the session. The responsibility lies with students to take ownership of their own revision, and use the resources and expertise available to you.

All students have a Revision Loyalty Card which they need to get signed by the teacher at every session they attend. These can be traded in at Student Reception and are the equivalent of 5 Habits card, or they can be used to discount Prom tickets or Leavers' Hoodies – each card is worth £2.
