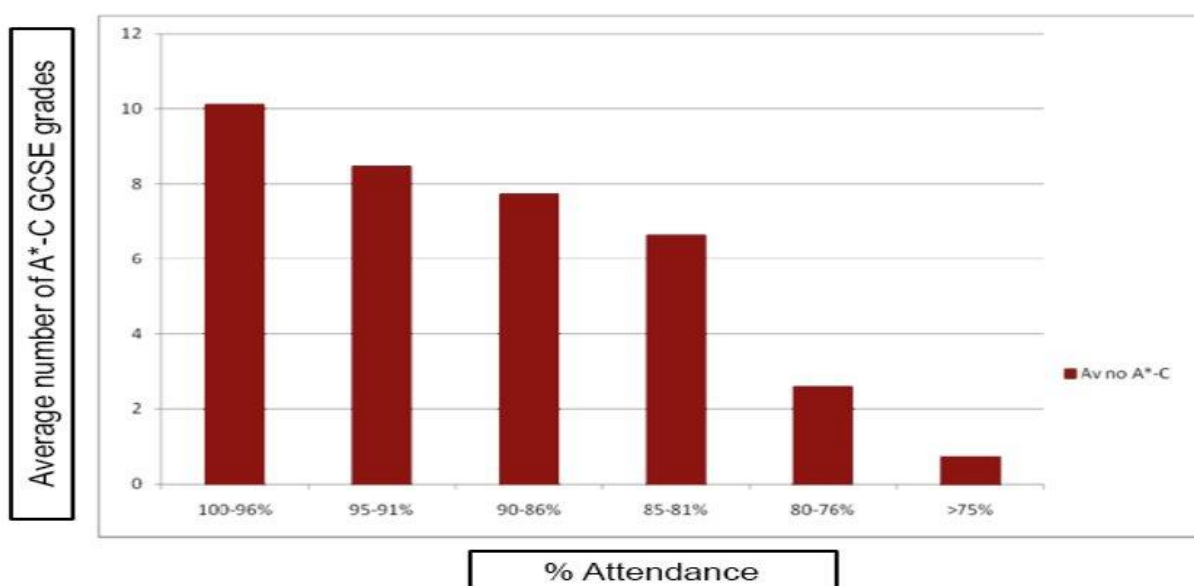

Friends of Old Buckenham High School

We are pleased to announce that the Friends of Old Buckenham High School have organised a clothes and shoe collection with Bag2School in order to raise funds once again.

Bag2School is the UK's leading textile recycler and fundraiser working with schools and since its inception in 2001 it has now paid out over £36 million.

As well as raising vitally needed funds for FOBHS, it also helps the environment by helping to divert unwanted textiles away from landfill. A recent DEFRA report has shown that textile collection schemes are helping to reduce the volume of textiles discarded as municipal solid waste. However, it is a fact that as a nation we still send 350,000 tonnes of textiles to landfill every year.

By getting involved in our **Bag2School** collection, you have an opportunity to sort through your cupboards and wardrobes and donate unwanted textiles in the bag provided – this can include adults' and children's clothes, shoes (tied together please), hats, belts, handbags and soft toys, (please refer to <http://uk.bag2school.com/> for full details). In addition to raising much needed funds it will also raise awareness amongst the children of the benefits of recycling and reuse.

You can use any bag (eg black bin bags) to donate your items and don't forget to ask grandparents, friends and neighbours to have a sort out as well!

Skills

Day to day tasks:

- Visit sellers and landlords to value properties
- Communicate regularly with potential buyers and tenants
- Arrange viewing appointments to show properties to potential buyers or renters.
- Negotiate between buyers and sellers
- Generate sales leads for mortgages and conveyancing
- Deal in person, on the phone and through email with solicitors, financial advisers and surveyors
- Manage auction sales
- Work to meet sales targets records

Subjects

Business Studies, Media and English.

Salary*

Basic salaries start at £15,000, rising to £40,000 and above for experienced estate agents. Estate agents often work on **commission** which means that you earn a percentage of the sale or rental price of any property you sell or rent on top of your basic salary.

Jobs

This sector is expected to grow by 4% by 2025.

Estate Agents

sell and rent out commercial and residential property, acting as negotiators between buyers and sellers.

Routes into the industry

You can get into this job through:

- **A university course**
- **An intermediate apprenticeship** as a junior estate agent
- Working towards this role by starting as a trainee sales negotiator and learning on the job or as an administrator in an estate agency or lettings company and working your way up
- Taking qualifications offered by an industry body like NAEA Propertymark

*In 2020 the average salary was £31,461, up 3.6% on 2019 Annual pay estimates are largely unaffected by Covid-19.
