<u>Wisepay</u>

Please could parents / carers remember to top up their child's Wisepay account to enable them to purchase their lunch. Please can students also remember to bring their Wisepay cards as this helps to keep the lunch queue moving.

If a student has any difficultly in purchasing their lunch, for example insufficient funds or damaged / forgotten card, please can they go to Student Reception who will be able to assist them and ensure they are able to purchase some lunch.

If you purchase any items on Wisepay i.e. ties, badges or stationery, students will need to collect these from Student Reception once the payment has been received. Revision guides that are purchased need to be collected by the student from their subject teacher.

Large Goods Vehicle (LGV) drivers (formerly

HGV drivers), collect, transport and deliver goods in rigid vehicles over 7.5 tonnes, articulated lorries and lorries pulling trailers.

Routes into the industry

You can apply for an **intermediate apprenticeship** as a large goods vehicle driver. Alternatively, you can train to do this role in the armed forces.

Working towards this role

If you're already working for a transport operator, your employer may be willing to put you through training to get your large good vehicle licence.

Specialist training providers You can find out more about driver training and the licences you need from the Freight Transport Association and the Road Haulage Association.

*In 2020 the average salary was £31,461, up 3.6% on 2019.

Large Goods Vehicle (LGV) Driver

Skills

Day to day tasks:

- Planning delivery schedules and routes with transport managers
- Supervising or helping to load and unload goods
- Making sure loads are safely secured
- Following traffic reports and changing your route if necessary
- Completing delivery paperwork and log books
- Check tyres, brakes, lights, oil, water and fuel levels and general condition of the vehicle

Subjects

You usually need some GCSEs, including English and Maths, for an intermediate apprenticeship.

Salary* £18,500 to £35,000.

Jobs

The workforce is projected to grow by 0.1% by 2027, creating 400 jobs. In the same period, 69.1% of the workforce is expected to retire, producing 230,200 jobs.

Annual pay estimates are largely unaffected by Covid-19.
