Parent Carer Survey for the Speech and Language Therapy Service for Children and Young People

Norfolk County Council are asking people for feedback on their experiences of Speech and Language Therapy services for children and young people.

Speech and Language Therapy services provide assessment, diagnosis and treatment of communication difficulties. It helps children and young people who have problems with speech, language and communications or difficulties with eating and swallowing. These services are sometimes called SaLT or SLT.
