We will be holding a raffle at each of the 4 performances and would be very grateful for any raffle prizes. These can be handed into the School Office.


Parent Online Safety Workshops:

Careers from Science



Forensic Scientist

How do I get into it?

You'll usually need:

- · 5 GCSE'S including Science
- •2 to 3 A levels, or equivalent, for a degree
- a degree in a scientific subject, such as biological sciences, chemistry or medical sciences, or a degree in forensic science.
 Degree subjects such as statistics and geology can be useful

What does this job entail?

As a forensic scientist you'll provide scientific evidence for use in courts of law to support the prosecution or defence in criminal and civil investigations. You'll be primarily concerned with searching for and examining contact trace material associated with crimes. This material can include:

- ·blood and other body fluids
- ·hairs
- ·fibres from clothing
- *paint and glass fragments
- tyre marks
- ·flammable substances used to start fires
- ·restricted drugs.

Although evidence is usually presented in writing as a formal statement or report, you may have to attend court to give your evidence in person as an expert witness

Salary:

- •Salaries for forensic scientists typically start at around £20,000.
- •With experience, this can increase to between £25,000 and £35,000.
- •Salaries at senior levels can reach £50,000 or more
