## LGBT+ History Month:

Our celebration day is planned for Friday 25<sup>th</sup> February, there will be much fun to be had and games to get involved in during lunchtime in the Main Hall. On this occasion, cash can be brought in to take part in activities.

Over the course of the planned ILT sessions and subject lessons which promote inclusivity and the discussion of both LGBT+ and wider cultural issues, among other things, you will hear and discuss language which is unacceptable to use with the OBHS community and wider world. If you have any other concerns relating to this, please raise them with either Mrs Morgan, or a member of staff you feel comfortable talking to.

# Mobile Caterer

## Mobile Caterers

(or street food traders) run their own businesses, serving customers food and drinks from a stall or van.

## Routes into the industry

You can get into this job through:

- An **apprenticeship** in professional cookery or an **advanced apprenticeship** as a senior production chef.
- Working towards this role.

You will also need to register with your local Environmental Health Department before you start trading.

## Skills

### Day to day tasks:

- Stock up on food ingredients and drinks
- Drive your mobile unit to a venue and set up
- Check the temperature of fridges and food
- Handle raw food safely
- Prepare and cook food to a high standard
- Serve customers and build up repeat business
- Wash up and keep your work area clean, tidy and safe.
- Keep track of finances and promote your business

## Subjects

Food and Nutrition, Business and Enterprise. If you enter the industry via an advanced apprenticeship, you will need 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4 (A\* to C), or equivalent, including English and Maths.

## Salary\*

The salary is variable, as mobile caterers manage their own hours

## Jobs

The industry was hit hard by the Covid lockdowns, but is expected to bounce back as restrictions ease

\*In 2020 the average salary was £31,461, up 3.6% on 2019.

Annual pay estimates are largely unaffected by Covid-19.
