Covid Vaccinations

The following would be in the event where a child missed the opportunity to be vaccinated for Covid-19 (1st or 2nd doses) at a school session, as arranged by the Community School Age Immunisation Service run by Hertfordshire Community NHS Trust:

What to do if your 12-15 year-old child missed their appointment at school to receive their Covid vaccination

If for any reason your child missed the opportunity to receive their vaccination at school or were declined their vaccination because they tested positive for COVID-19 in the last 12 weeks, you have the following alternative options. You will need to accompany your child to any venues offering the vaccination to give consent.

Booking vaccination appointments online:

You can book your child's 1st dose online from the day they turn 12. You can usually book their 2nd dose from 24 hours after they had their 1st dose. You'll be offered appointment dates from 12 weeks after their 1st dose. [Book a COVID-19 vaccination appointment](#)

Getting the vaccine at a walk-in vaccination site

Your child can get a 1st dose at a walk-in COVID-19 vaccination site from the day they turn 12. They can get a 2nd dose if it's been 12 weeks since their 1st dose. [Find a walk-in COVID-19 vaccination site](#)

Prison Officer

Prison Officers maintain discipline, supervise and rehabilitate inmates in prisons, remand centres and young offenders' institutions.

Routes into the industry

You can get into this job through:

- An **Advanced Apprenticeship** as a Custody and Detention Officer.
- A **College Course** in Public Services.
- **Applying directly:** You don't need any particular qualifications, but you must be aged 18 or over and be eligible to work in the UK and pass the online **Prison Officer Selection Test (POST)** and enhanced background checks.

Skills

Day to day tasks:

- Keeping inmates secure
- Carrying out security checks and searches
- Supervising prisoners and maintaining order
- Supporting vulnerable prisoners
- Going with prisoners on external visits like court appearances or hospital appointments
- Promoting anti-bullying and suicide prevention policies
- Preparing inmates for release through rehabilitation programmes
- Updating records and writing reports on prisoners

Subjects

There are no set requirements for this role, but you will need to meet the minimum GCSE requirements in English and Maths to access apprenticeships or college courses.

Salary*

Jobs in this sector start at £22,000 and rise to £38,000 for an experienced officer.

Jobs

The number of jobs in this sector is expected to decrease by 1% by 2025.

*In 2019 the national average salary was £30,378

Wisepay
