
Duke of Edinburgh Award

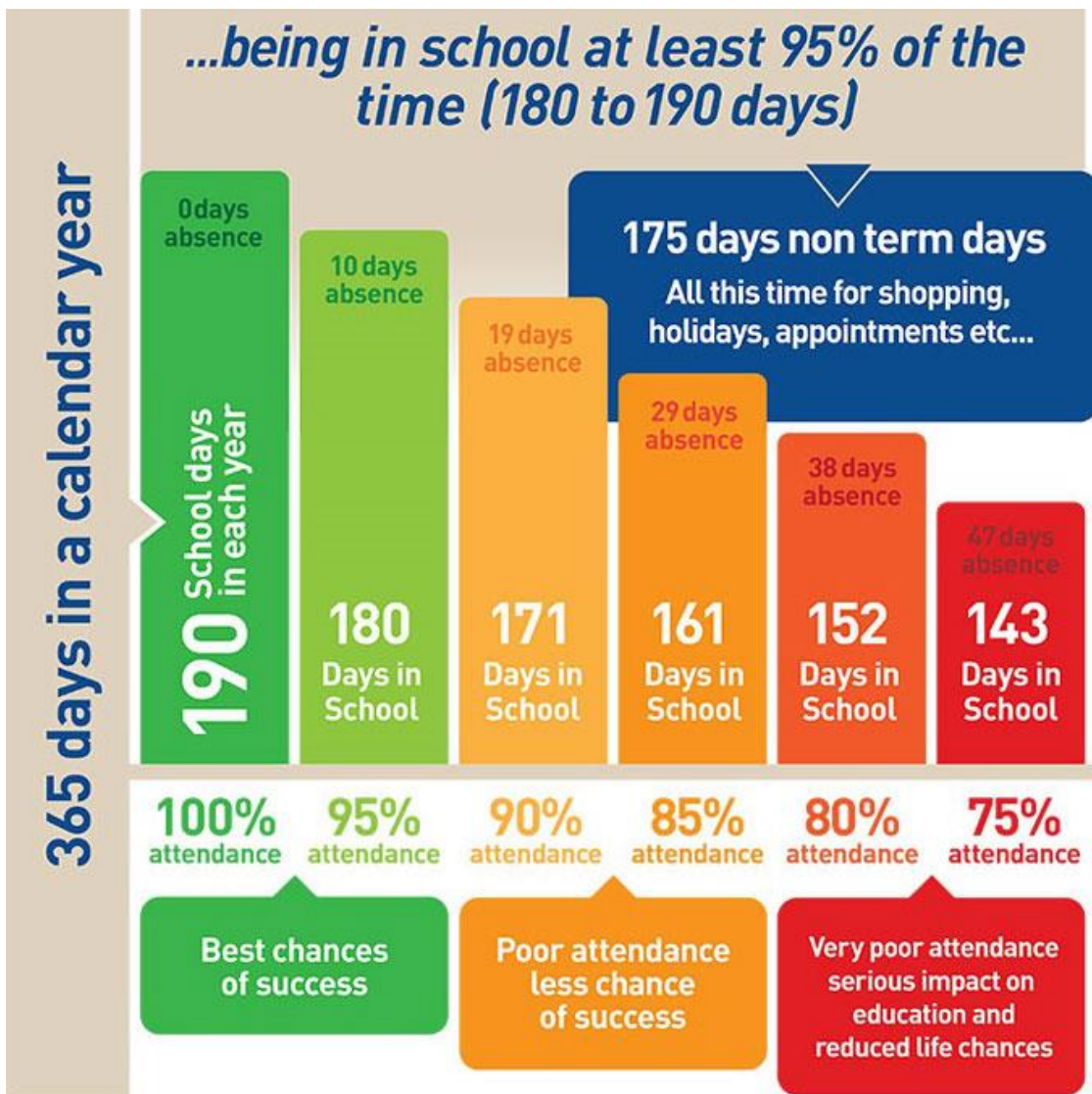

Humanitarian Aid Worker

Humanitarian Aid Workers

provide support, food, resources, and infrastructure to people affected by man-made and natural disasters like war, famine, earthquakes and outbreaks of disease.

Routes into the industry

- **Volunteering**
To get a paid job as an aid worker, you'll need experience, so most people start out as an unpaid volunteer with a charity.
- **University**
For longer-term projects, career-specific qualifications are required, for example a degree in medicine or healthcare, education, languages or engineering.

Skills

Day to day tasks:

- Provide emergency aid like food, shelter and medical supplies
- Organise transport, sort and handle deliveries
- Oversee the distribution of goods
- Recruit, train and organise local people to work as staff and volunteers
- Network with other organisations and government officials in affected areas
- Work with communities longer term, for example, to roll out healthcare or education programmes, or work on building or engineering projects

Subjects

Geography, History and Religious Studies.

Salary*

From £17,000 to £29,000, depending on experience.

Jobs

This sector is expected to grow by 6% by 2025.

*In 2020 the average salary was £31,461, up 3.6% on 2019.

Annual pay estimates are largely unaffected by Covid-19.
